# **Cemetery Policy - Decorations**

- In the interest of the safety of employees and visitors, no glass or ceramic objects are permitted in the Cemetery.
- No decorative stone is permitted. Such objects will be removed by cemetery
- Fall/Spring cleanup days will be fixed as a weekend in October/April respectively. All decorations must be removed prior to the first day of October/April. Decorating may resume the first day of November/May.
- Permanent Decorations: Statues, flower pots, and plastic vigil lights are permitted only if they are part of the stone.
- Flush flowerpots are permitted next to the stone only with permission of the Management.
- No fences, corner posts, or other border arrangements are permitted.
- Anything that violates these policies will be removed without prior notification.
- No raised mounds are permitted on cemetery lots.
- Graves must be level with the contour of the cemetery ground.
- Up to three arrangements of flowers are permitted on the grave at the time of burial.

# SUNDAY REFLECTION

Our readings today call us to love as Christ loves. This request from our Lord is no small endeavor. It is something we must work at every day in every moment. When we put it at the forefront of our minds and hearts, and strive to live it out each day, it will transform our lives and impact others too.

As St. John tells us in our Second Reading, it is "not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent His Son as expiation for our sins." Recall that God loved us first, not because of what we do for Him, but because He created us out of love. His love for us is pure and radical. In our Gospel, Jesus says, "Love one another as I have loved you." The ways Jesus has loved us and continues to love us are endless.

Look at each moment and think, "How can I better love Jesus right now?" or "How can I lay down my life in this moment?" for it is in loving Christ that we will better love others, and it is in loving others that we love Christ Himself.
